Leading the association next year as president is **Mark Zimmerman**, Seneca County Engineer. **Chris Bauserman**, Delaware County Engineer, will take office as first vice president. The CEOA second vice president will be **Paul Gruner**, Montgomery County Engineer. **James Wiechart**, Mercer County Engineer; continues as treasurer and current president **Douglas Davis**, Muskingum County Engineer; moves into the immediate past president office.

The CEOA business meeting will be conducted during the annual County Commissioners Association of Ohio and County Engineers Association of Ohio (CCAO/CEAO) Winter Conference.

County engineers are responsible for the maintenance, repair and capital improvements of county highways, roads and bridges in Ohio.
